

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Ice Chalet is committed to providing a safe and positive environment for our community members' physical, emotional, and social development. We want to encourage an environment free of misconduct.



R-E-S-P-E-C-T

Members of our skating community are expected to exhibit good sportsmanship and be courteous and respectful to their fellow community members and to visitors, including skaters, teachers, parents/guardians, officials, and guests at all times. Bullying, intimidation, threats, and harassment will not be tolerated. Foul language will not be tolerated. Unsafe or discourteous behavior of any kind will not be tolerated. Inappropriate communications and/or interactions with under-age skaters, including anything that might be considered “grooming,” will not be tolerated.

Interactions covered by this policy include in-person actions as well as communications on social media, in emails, in chat rooms, in text messages, or through any other forms of communication.

Advanced skaters are expected to mentor and exhibit patience towards younger, less experienced skaters. Everyone was a beginner sometime!

Community members are expected to refrain from using drugs, alcohol, or any other form of inebriation that might impair one's judgment while in the facility when under-age community members are present.

Reporting unsafe or inappropriate behavior: Bring the issue to the attention of the Skating Director, Assistant Skating Director, or any teacher as quickly as possible. This includes rumors, but please note that rumors are often untrue, and every effort should be made to resist passing on any rumors to anyone other than one of the rink personnel identified above.

DRESS CODE

Skating requires stretching in a variety of body positions and can be revealing, embarrassing, and dangerous if performed wearing inappropriate clothing. Skaters under the age of 18 are asked to avoid wearing overly revealing clothing, such as low-cut tops, crop tops and bra-like tops that expose bare midriffs, and low-cut pants that expose the belly button. Sagging (below waist) pants will not be permitted in our facility for safety reasons. Stretchy and comfortable clothes are encouraged. Clothes may not display obscene, profane, violent, or offensive writing or images. Management reserves the right to request that clothing be turned inside out and/or covered.
